	• Have had training in the technique and management of the supply of home oxygen and are confident in using the equipment. Written documentation supplied			
	 Home areas assessed re: suitability storing oxygen Nursing Staff/Dolby (please delete as appropriate) 			
	Are able to use a monitor if required			
	Have list of contact details and know who to contact for different sources of help

	Order and re order supplies (e.g. cannulae, tape etc.) via oxygen supplier or their Public Health Nurse			
	Have oxygen delivery equipment replaced, repaired and serviced via oxygen supplier
